Cost is **\$55 per person**, and assumes we have at least 25 attendees including 1 chaperone for every 6 scouts, and a minimum of 7 adult chaperones. Parents, please sign up to Chaperone. At a minimum indicate your willingness to do so. (Siblings are definitely welcome if accompanied by a parent)

Includes bed time snack (eat dinner before arriving) and continental breakfast.

We will carpool via 8 or fewer vehicles. There is very limited parking on the pier. Pay lots nearby are \$15.

General Information:

The Pampanito is owned and operated by the San Francisco Maritime National Park Association.

The sub is a national historical landmark, has an interesting history. It must be treated with respect and care.

There are a maximum of 48 berths on the sub. Spots are allocated on a first-to-pay basis. There is a minimum of 25 attendees, and there must be at least 7 adult chaperons accompanying the group AND a minimum of 1 chaperone to 6 scouts.

After all scouts who want to attend are allocated space, and provided they have paid, siblings age 9 and older are welcome to attend provided a parent is chaperoning. Please call or email Adrian Smith first, to inquire about space available for siblings.

Watch Duty and Cleaning

Between 12pm and 7am there will be seven watch sections. These will be staffed by chaperones and optionally by scouts as well. This is mandatory!

All participants will be responsible for cleaning the heads, common areas, per Sub cleaning instructions, before departing in the morning.

Items to Bring

- Each crewmember is responsible for bringing his/her own sleeping bag, pillow, and personal items. The bunks on board the submarine do not have sheets or blankets. Please pack sparingly (space is limited)
- Warm jacket, fleece, in layers (the sub is warm inside, but nights can be quite chilly on the pier)
- Pajamas or sweats, slippers (floors are COLD and HARD)
- Toiletries, Flashlight, Camera
- If you want to purchase a Pampanito patch, bring \$6.
- Cards, board games, or DVDs (Sub does not stock any entertainment, but has a TV/DVD player in the forward torpedo room)
- **Ensolite pad to sit on** while watching Movies. The steel deck is COLD!

Do Not Bring

- **Any** personal food, candy, or gum. (Crumbs and scraps attract pests)
- Cooking gear. Hot water is provided.
- Personal electronic/smart-phones

General Schedule of Events

Evening:

1930 Arrive and unload, park vehicles at designated spaces on the pier (see Parking Instructions); group leader meets with staff to complete necessary paperwork

2000 Group tours pier exhibits with a USS *Pampanito* staff educator

2030 Review the rules of conduct as a group, then board the submarine for an audio tour

2115 Fire and safety drill onboard

2130 Conning tower tour
2200 Load gear onto the submarine and assign/organize
bunks
2230 Movie, games, evening snack, etc

Nighttime:

2400 Lights out; night watch established; begin watch
activities

Morning:

0700 Reveille. Dress and begin packing up gear,
continental breakfast, begin cleaning the boat

0730 Pack gear off the boat, clean compartments as
vacated

0800 Gear should be completely loaded off; staff does
final inspection of cleaning job

0830 Posting of colors Flag Ceremony, group
photograph

0900 Off the boat. Guests are welcome to tour the other
exhibits.

We will assemble in the parking area at 6:30pm
and enter as a complete group at 7 pm Saturday
evening. Please be EARLY, and allow for SF
traffic. If for some reason you are running late

please call the Organizer, Adrian Smith, at 650
208 1802.

You MUST eat dinner before you arrive. We
will have pizza for a late night snack (one or two
pieces each, not half a pizza!). Scouts **will be**
hungry if they don't eat prior to arriving.

In the morning, after a light continental
breakfast and then cleaning the boat, we will
have a flag ceremony at 830-9am a.m.

You are welcome to stay and enjoy the other
Maritime Museum attractions at 9 am as part of
your fees paid for the overnight, or return to
Menlo Park via car pools.

or park elsewhere after 8:30 am.**

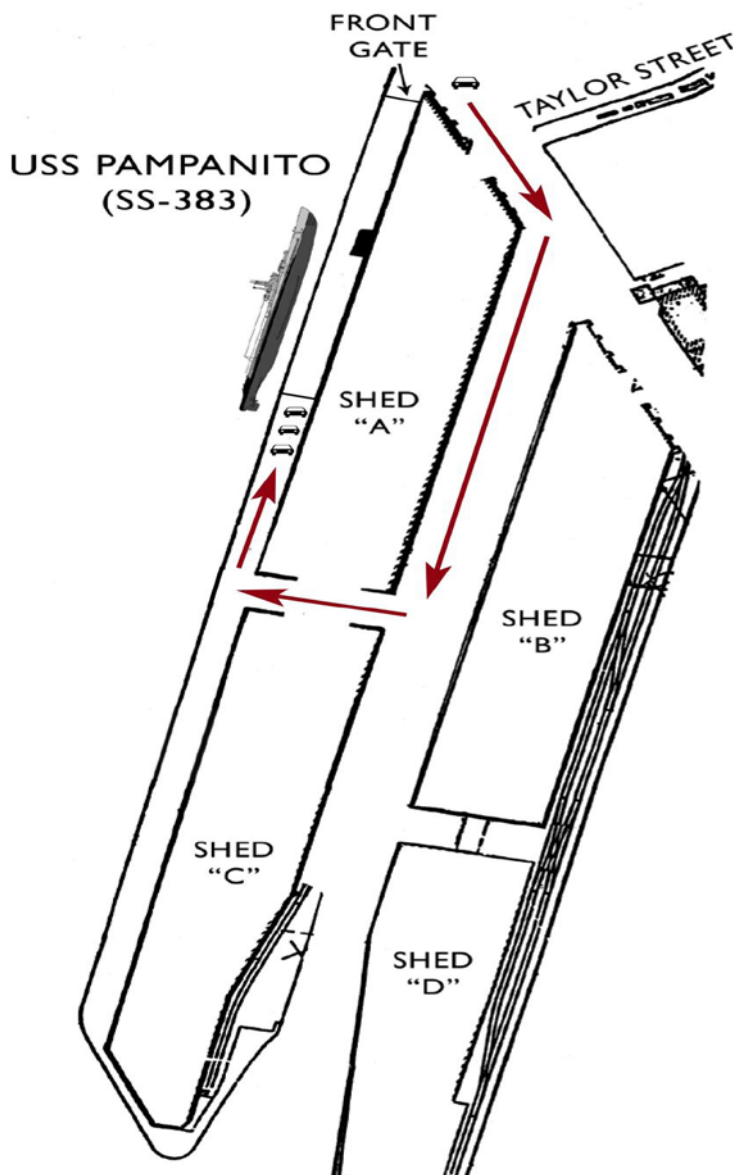

USS PAMPANITO Directions and PARKING GUIDE

From Highway 101 (Peninsula):

- Follow Highway 101 up to the split with Interstate 80.
- Bear right onto route 80 towards the Bay Bridge.
- Take the Fourth St./Bryant St. exit---this is the **very last** San Francisco exit, so don't miss it!
- Bear left onto Bryant St. and follow it all the way to Embarcadero (about 6 blocks)
- Turn left onto Embarcadero and continue around the city waterfront until you reach the Wharf area
- Turn right on Taylor St
- Pier 45 and the Pampanito are at the foot of Taylor St



Welcome to Pier 45 and the USS Pampanito!

This map will help you to find the parking spaces designated for your group's overnight stay.

Note: Parking may vary for each program, please follow staff instruction upon your arrival outside of "Shed A"

The arrows on the map will guide you around to the back entrance of "Shed A" where your group's parking spaces are located. A staff member will be present at this entrance to assist your group in accessing our parking area.

DO NOT enter through the front of the shed or take a ticket from the entrance.

If you do you will be responsible for paying any parking fees incurred.

Please note: There are a total of 10 parking spaces ONLY, available for overnight program participants. They are available from 6:30pm to 8:30am.

Extra cars will need to find paid parking at a nearby garage or park on the street.
